



Salida Brewers Rendezvous Campout

We're camping in the dirt on BLM land we've staked out for the weekend. Other than a few group activities, you're responsible for your own supplies. Here's a checklist to help you plan. If you forget something, there's a 7-Eleven nearby and a Walmart in town.

Pack It In

Personal Camp Supplies

- All tent or RV camping stuff
- Sleeping bag, camping mattress, pillow (clothes stuffed in a pillow case also work)
- Clothes for hot days and cool nights
- Real shoes for camp (there are stickers, thorns, and critters), but flip-flops are fine for the festival
- Sunscreen and insect repellent
- Camp chair — some people take one down to the festival as well
- Coffee cup (travel mugs work best)
- Unbreakable beer cup — sure, it tastes better in glass, but get over it, we're camping
- Earplugs — if you're not one to party hearty, you may find these helpful
- Space gear! We want all club members to dress up so that our group is recognizable at the rendezvous!

Food/Beverage Supplies

- Water — 5 gallons to chip in for cooking and dishes, and your own drinking water
- Ice — 10 lb. bag to contribute to the group, and your own needs
- Beer! Bottles and kegs are welcome, but bring your own ice, keg and/or jockey box supplies
- Non-alcoholic beverages, if you like
- Food for Friday night and Sunday morning, if you eat in camp
- Pot, skillet, utensils, if you plan to cook
- Cash for tipping the shuttle driver (recommended \$5), food at the festival, and if you're buying tickets for the festival, the cash line is always shorter

What We'll Provide

- A common kitchen — we'll have 2 or 3 camp stoves and some basic cooking equipment
- Coffee — don't worry about it unless you need your fancy-ass espresso maker
- Trash bags — near the kitchen tent
- Recycling — near the beer tent

Pack It Out

- Leave excess packaging at home (a new flashlight in those overkill plastic packages, for instance).
- Collect and take home your own "clean" trash — things like bottles that can be stowed in your vehicle.
- Empty beer bottles — we'll have some boxes to collect empty bottles, which attendees can take home.
- Heading to 7-Eleven for something? See if you can grab a small amount of trash to dispose of while there.
